








BACKGROUND

The <u>Women in Digital Business</u> (WIDB) initiative is a global programme designed to equip women entrepreneurs with the digital skills required to thrive in an evolving Al-driven economy.

Developed by the International Training Centre of the ILO and Microsoft Philanthropies, the programme focuses on building digital and entrepreneurship skills for women entrepreneurs to grow their businesses online.

WIDB aims to bridge the gender gap in digital entrepreneurship by providing accessible training to women, regardless of where they are on their entrepreneurial journey.

Since its launch, Kenya has been the country where Women in Digital Business has gained the most traction: as of October 2024, we have reached 660 trainers and through them 7951 women entrepreneurs.

The <u>ILO PROSPECTS</u> project in Kenya and the <u>Opportunity Fund project</u> "Promotion, inclusion and protection of refugees and host communities in the gig economy", funded by the Netherlands, help business owners and freelancers adopt digital technology to expand markets, innovate, and improve efficiency. This support is especially valuable for women, including those from displaced communities, helping them size business opportunities in the digital economy while navigating its challenges.

This event seeks to shed light on the achievements of WIDB and PROSPECTS in Kenya and open up a broader discussion on some of the ways we can support Inclusive Digital Transformation in Kenya.

OBJECTIVES

During our half-day session, we will bring together actors from the Kenyan digital ecosystem to:

- Highlight the current landscape of the digital economy in Kenya and identify key barriers and opportunities for women entrepreneurs.
- Facilitate dialogue among stakeholders, including government officials, social partners, Women Entrepreneurs' Associations and the donor community, to discuss strategic support for women entrepreneurs to access digital opportunities.
- Showcase successful WIDB case studies and models that have effectively supported women's entrepreneurship in the digital sphere.
- Introduce new tools and approaches developed by the PROSPECTS opportunity fund on the gig economy.
- Identify opportunities for joint and complementary action for a more impactful and coordinated response seeking to integrate women entrepreneurs in the digital economy.
